Singapore Raptor Report Spring Migration, March 2011

Summary:

A total of 290 migrant raptors of 10 species were recorded this month, a decline of 2 species compared to last month. The **Oriental Honey Buzzard** (OHB) overtook the Black Baza to become the most numerous raptor this month. A total of 171 OHBs were recorded, mostly on migration – 123 birds at Tuas on the 30^{th} by Martti Siponen and 38 birds at Changi on the 25^{th} by Lim Kim Seng and Lee Tiah Khee. The **Black Baza** was the second most numerous raptor with 81 birds. This included a kettle of 56 birds at Tuas, also on the 30^{th} , recorded by Martti Siponen. The **Japanese Sparrowhawk** was the third most numerous with 11 birds.

Now, for the surprises. A flock of 8 **Grey-faced Buzzards** gave Nicholas Tan a pleasant surprise at Tanah Merah grasslands on the 12th as these scarce migrants circled high in the sky allowing him to get some photos of this handsome raptor. A small flock of 3 **Jerdon's Bazas** were seen and photographed by Con Foley and Danny Lau at Changi on the 13th. This is a new 'late date' for the Jerdon's Baza and represents an extension of 19 days, compared to the previous 'late date' of 22 Feb in 2009.

The other migrant raptors included 5 Chinese Sparrowhawks, 4 Ospreys, 4 Peregrine Falcons, 2 Eastern Marsh Harriers and 1 Common Buzzard.

For the resident raptors, a rare **Crested Serpent Eagle** was seen and photographed st Sungei Buloh Wetland Reserve (SBWR) near the car park on the 19th by Raj Krishnan and other birders. SBWR also produced this month's only record of the rare **Crested Goshawk** on the 20th, by Horst Flotow, during the bird census.

A single Grey-headed Fish Eagle was recorded this month. Rounding up the resident raptors are the usual **Black-winged Kites**, **Brahminy Kites**, **White-bellied Sea Eagles**, and **Changeable Hawk-eagles**.
