Singapore Raptor Report Spring Migration, February 2014

## Summary for migrant species:

In February, 56 raptors of 10 migrant species were recorded. The **Common Kestrel** continued to be present at Tuas South till 9 Feb, indicating over-wintering at the site where it was first recorded on 19 Oct 13. An additional juvenile/female type Common Kestrel was also recorded at Old Choa Chu Kang Road on 10 Feb. Coupled with the 2 seen at Pulau Punggol last month, this could be the most fruitful season for the Common Kestrel.

The other migrant raptors included the usual suspects - Osprey, Black Baza, Oriental Honey Buzzard, Japanese Sparrowhawk, and Peregrine Falcon. Two Booted Eagles continued to be present at Seletar North Link. The only Jerdon's Baza recorded was at Lorong Halus, same for the Chinese Sparrowhawk. The only Eastern Marsh Harrier recorded was at Kranji Marsh.

## **Summary for resident raptors:**

The nesting of the **Grey-headed Fish Eagle** at Bukit Batok Town Park (Little Guilin) appeared to be successful and the display flight of the **Crested Goshawk** was observed at the Botanical Gardens. On 12 Feb, an **Oriental Honey Buzzard**, possibly of the *torquatus* subspecies, was photographed in flight with a stick in its talons at Neo Tiew Lane 2, a possible indication of nest building.
