Singapore Raptor Report Spring Migration, March 2014

Summary for migrant species:

In March, 84 raptors of 10 migrant species were recorded. Chan K C had the good luck of encountering at least 30 **Black Bazas** over Jurong Lake area on the 21st of the month. The birds were circling for about a minute before moving off. The other lucky birder, through sheer persistence, was Low Choon How, who recorded a male **Pied Harrier** at Tuas South on the 8th of the month. He also recorded a female **Eastern Marsh Harrier** on the same day, and again on the 23rd. Alan Owyong also had the good fortune of recording a **Booted Eagle** at Changi during the Bird Census.

There were 3 **Jerdon's Baza** at Lorong Halus, an improvement over last month's single record. On the other hand, the wintering **Common Kestrel** at Tuas was not recorded and may have started its northward migration for its breeding grounds.

The other migrant raptors included the **Osprey** at the northern coastal areas, **Oriental Honey Buzzard** throughout the island, **Japanese Sparrowhawk**, and a few **Peregrine Falcon** and **Chinese Sparrowhawk**.

Summary for resident raptors:

An immature **Crested Goshawk** was photographed by Simon Siow at Lower Pierce on the 9th of the month. Nesting activities were recorded for the **Black-winged Kite**, **Brahminy**

Kite and White-bellied Sea Eagle. The juvenile Grey-headed Fish Eagles continued to be present at Bukit Batok Town Park (Little Guilin). The Changeable Hawk-eagle was also recorded at various localities.
