Since introducing the works of Mother Goose nursery rhymes into my lesson plan, I have experienced several positive progress in my students:

- * their intonation and speed have improved
- * oftentimes their pronunciation and rhythmic phrasing sound naturally native
- * they are eager to learn more and more of the nursery rhymes without being bored
- * their English speaking is very energetic and loud
- * unlike conversational phrases, they can be said at anytime during the day; I often hear my students saying some of the phrases during their play time before the lesson
- * they are exposed to traditional western cultures through the rhymes and get a glimpse at what native speakers have learned during their childhood
- * the students learn these rhymes effortlessly by repeating the short lines
- * the student's interests and curiosity are nurtured through the strange world of Mother Goose
